

### ABSTRAC


DLIST, Digital Library of Library and Information Science and Technology, is a digital repository for research and practice publications in the Information Sciences. It is based on the open access eprints model; but, materials in the collections extend beyond the formal, scholarly literature of pre and post published research papers to include other types of content such as evaluation instruments and datasets. Besides a subject focus on information systems and technologies, documents about the impact of information technology, evaluation in terms of users' information behaviors, user-focused development of information systems, and intellectual property materials are collected.


